Holy Baptism: A Gift of Grace

Holy Baptism is one of the two Sacraments practiced by the United Methodist Church, along with Holy Communion. In baptism, we celebrate God's gracious initiative—God reaching out to us in love before we are able to respond. Baptism is first and foremost God's act, not ours. Through water and the Holy Spirit, we are welcomed into the family of faith, marked as Christ's own, and incorporated into the Body of Christ.

United Methodists baptize people of all ages, including infants. This reflects our belief in prevenient grace—the grace of God that is already at work in our lives before we are aware of it. Just as God's love is not earned, baptism is not dependent on our understanding or decision, but on God's promise. The Book of Discipline affirms that baptism is “a sign of God's grace and our entrance into the church” and is rooted in God's covenant faithfulness rather than human action.

This understanding differs from traditions that practice Believers' Baptism, which reserve baptism for those old enough to make a personal profession of faith. While we honor and respect these traditions, United Methodists believe that baptism is not primarily a testimony of our faith, but a sign of God's covenant with us. Scripture reminds us that God's promises extend to households and generations. Our response of faith grows over time as we live into the promises made at baptism.

Because baptism is God's enduring act of grace, we do not re-baptize. The Book of Discipline teaches that baptism is “once and for all” and need not be repeated, even if a person's faith journey includes periods of doubt or distance from the church. As the Apostle Paul reminds us, “There is one Lord, one faith, one baptism.” God's promise does not expire, even when our faith falters.

However, we regularly Reaffirm Our Baptism, especially on Baptism of the Lord Sunday. In reaffirmation, we remember God's claim on our lives, renew our commitment to Christ, and give thanks for the grace that continues to shape us. The Book of Discipline encourages reaffirmation as a meaningful way to renew our baptismal covenant without repeating the sacrament itself. At Edisto Island UMC, we celebrate baptism as a sacred gift—one that calls us to live each day as beloved children of God, growing in faith, hope, and love. Join us Sunday, December 11, 2026 at 10:00 AM as we celebrate Baptism of the Lord and reaffirm our Baptisms.
