“The Unfinished Call”

Matthew 4:12-23

This Sunday, we gather around a truth that is both humbling and full of hope: we are unfinished people, and God is not done with us yet.

Henri Nouwen's piercing reminder—"He who thinks that he is finished is finished"—echoes through Matthew's story of Jesus calling fishermen from their boats. The call to "Follow me" is not a graduation certificate; it is an invitation into a lifelong apprenticeship with Christ. Peter and Andrew step away from their nets, not into perfection, but into a journey marked by stumbling, learning, repenting, and being restored.

John Wesley would call this the ongoing work of sanctifying grace—God shaping us, week by week, into people who reflect Christ's love. This shaping happens as we gather again and again, letting the gospel form us. We should attempt to hear the text not as a lecture but as a living experience. Why? It helps us see that Jesus' call is vocational: "I will make you fishers of people." The making takes time. It takes community. It takes grace.

We live in a world that prizes completion, certainty, and self-sufficiency. But Jesus calls us away from those nets—away from the illusion that we have arrived—and into a community where humility, perseverance, and mutual formation are the way of life.

This Sunday, we will step into that story again.

We will remember that the shoreline is still before us.

We will hear the call that still comes.

We will worship the One who is still forming us.

Whether you are a longtime member, a returning friend, or a seeker wondering where you belong, **this is a Sunday for you.** The unfinished, the curious, the weary, the hopeful—Christ calls all of us.

Come ready to lay down your nets.

Come ready to be shaped.

Come ready to follow again.

Because the good news is this: God is not finished with us—and that is our hope.

We look forward to worshiping with you.

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
